Knowing By Chaplain Lee Alphen

Successful trainers really know their horses. The best parents understand their kids and why they do the things they do. Great teachers study their students and learn to reach them with more than textbook answers.

Relationships mold us into the people we become. How are our relationships with God Who is always there for us? God knows us intimately and God's love, care and concern never waiver. "The word of the Lord came to [Jeremiah], saying, 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you" (Jeremiah 1:4-5). How well do we know God?

Scottish Pastor Robert Murray McShane, talks about the difference between knowing God and knowing about God. Henry and Richard Blackaby offer a few examples in their book, Hearing God's Voice. The Magi followed the star all the way to Jerusalem. They told Herod about the star and asked where the Messiah was to be born. Herod asked the Jewish leaders. These scripture scholars were very smart and immediately answered, "Bethlehem" (Matthew 2:1-6). The Magi, though less schooled in the scriptures, continued five more miles to the stable and greeted the Savior while the scholars remained in Jerusalem. In spite of their "knowledge," the scholars missed the Messiah.

Half a century later. Paul made the same mistake. He was a zealous Pharisee. an expert in religion. Yet Paul did not recognize Jesus as the Messiah as he went about persecuting Christians (Acts 9: 1-2). After his conversion, he confessed that everything he had done before was wrong (Philippians 3:7-8). He said, "I want to know Christ" (Philippians 3:7). His new focus was to serve Jesus Christ and win the prize of eternity in heaven with Him (Philippians 3:13-14).

My niece's blind step-daughter, Daisy, can study all about light in college. Yet her younger brother, Emmett, who has never thought about what light is, knows more about light than Daisy will ever know because he experiences it.

Jesus tells us, "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you" (Luke 11:9). What? Are you telling me God has not answered all your prayers?

I read a story about James L Kraft, the founder of Kraft Foods. As a young man he wanted to be the most famous manufacturer and salesman of cheese in the world. He began by selling cheese on the streets of Chicago with his pony, Paddy, and a wagon. After months of hard work, he told Paddy he was discouraged because they were not making any money. Kraft told Paddy they had things turned around and needed to put God first. Kraft made a covenant with God that he would first serve God and then work as God directed for the rest of his life.

The Magi sought Jesus and found Him. Paul, after being knocked to the ground, recognized Jesus and became a great disciple (Acts 9:3-18). Kraft realized his priorities were wrong, put God first in his life and went on to achieve his life's dream.

Horses respond when their handlers really care about them. Kids who are secure in their parent's love do better. Students try harder for teachers who go the extra mile.

Our passage from Luke goes on to say, "the Father in heaven gives the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him (Luke 11:13). It is really the Spirit of God present in our lives that helps us become everything God made us to be. God's Spirit living and working in and through us brings God's blessings in every situation.

So, let's all examine our relationships with God. Perhaps they need a little tweaking.





Obituaries

Sharon Joan Finn, 54, of Newton, IL died July 1 at her residence. Sharon and her husband, Fred Finn, Jr owned, bred and raced many Standardbred horses during their time together. They raced mostly on the fair circuit in their state of residence where Sharon relished her time with the horses and doting on her grandchildren. She was also a CNA.



Ronald "Mickey" Foster, 82, died on May 11 in

Yarmouth, ME. Growing up in Standish, ME, he was a standout baseball player and later participated on a local all-star Triple-C team as pitcher and much feared left-handed batter. He attended the Jack Rossiter Baseball School, and was one of the few to be signed with the Washington Nationals farm league in 1953, moving up



to the Piedmont League in 1954. In 1956, Mickey joined the US Army. Then, he and his wife, Cathy Dawes, raced harness horses at all the local fairs, Scarborough Downs, Foxboro, Mass. and Hinsdale NH. On his passing, a Memorial service officiated by CHHA member, Ernest Lowell, was held at the Dolby Funeral Chapel in Windham, Maine.

Leo C. McNamara, 60, a thirdgeneration harness horseman and executive administrator of the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey died June 12. In addition to his duties at the SBOANJ, Leo owned and managed Two Gaits Farm in Columbus, NJ, named after his family farm in



Carmel, IN. His grandfather stood Hal Dale, and bred the great pacer Adios at Two Gaits Farm. As farm manager at Holly Lane Stud and later Almahurst Farm in Lexington, Leo managed Nihilator's first years at stud, raised Laag and Leah Almahurst, among others. He came to New Jersey to be farm manager of Dreamaire Stud in Columbus, where he raised Camtastic and Fake Left, managed part of Cam Fella's stallion career and then started the new Two Gaits Farm.

The Rev. Nicholas Salios of Worcester, PA died May 15.

Nick spent his life serving God as a chaplain. He was awarded the Army Commendation Medal for Service after 20 years as an Army Chaplain. The next 20 years he spent as Chaplain at Penn National for Race Track Chaplaincy of America. Nick also served on the staff of American Baptist Churches and National Ministries. His mission assignments took him to Haiti,



Nicaragua, Managua, El Salvador, the Middle East, and Rome.

Benjamin C. Stafford Jr, 45, of Felton, DE, died July 6

following a wood tick bite. Ben was partners with his father for nearly 30 years, owning, training and driving Standardbreds, where he was well known and liked in the racing community. He won 693 races in his career as a driver and piloted quality horses such as Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund champion Badlands Jenna, Good Bet, Badlands And Art, Mudslide and Scout Hanover. He also enjoyed



playing golf, ice hockey, rooting for the Philadelphia Flyers, and hunting.
