
The Liar

God threw Lucifer, the devil, out of heaven for being jealous of God and wanting to be God (Isaiah 14:12-15, Revelation 20:1-10). This jealous devil prowls the earth trying to ruin us now and forever. He is jealous of us, God's people, and the love God shows us. In retaliation he spends his time lying to us and trying to lead us astray so we can be miserable like him.

Money, power, possessions, drugs – sneering, Satan dangles them in front of us as prizes that promise happiness. and everything He made.

Like Adam and Eve, people today, just as people all through the centuries, sometimes don't trust God. The evil one plants a seed of suspicion that God is a rival out to curtail their freedom. Satan tricks people into thinking that, if they really want to be happy, they have to cast God aside, trusting deceit rather than truth. Satan has even been successful in getting some people to follow in his footsteps (Isaiah 14:12-15). Some think they themselves are gods.

History of the Hymn

"Lift High the Cross" was originally written for a festival celebration in Winchester Cathedral in 1887 by George William Kitchen who was Dean of the Cathedral.

The Anglican Priest, Michael Robert Newbolt, modified the words for publication in an Anglican Hymnal in 1916. From here the hymn made its way to other hymnals and became widely used throughout the English speaking world.

Lift High the Cross was first published in the United States in 1974 and is sung as a processional in most of the Christian churches,

Through the verses we are reminded many on earth continually do battle against evil and those in heaven have triumphed over evil.

Let's help others find their way to the victorious Christ who emerged from the tomb after suffering a tortuous death so we can all go to heaven.

14. Claude was a breeder, owner, trainer and driver of Standardbred racehorses that raced primarily at Batavia Downs and Buffalo Raceway.



Russell Cyrill Hill, 83, of Fort Wayne, passed away Feb 20. After serving four years in the Air Force Russell became a Norfolk and Southern Railway train dispatcher for the next 42 years. He then owned and operated a TV repair business. Russ's passion was harness horses. He owned, trained, and raced horses over a 52 year period. He was inducted

into the Northwestern Ohio Colt Racing Association Hall of Fame as a driver-trainer in 2006.

Dr Richard J. Hall ('Doc Hall') of Eden, NY died Sunday, Feb 1. He was 91. Dr. Hall was a longtime breeder and owner of Standardbreds in western New York. He also served for many years as Buffalo Raceway track veterinarian. He was involved in harness racing for 80 years.

Art Johnson died Feb 15. Art started his horse racing career as



grounds superintendent at Le Mesa Park in Raton, NM, after graduating from New Mexico Highlands University and serving three years in the United States Navy. He quickly rose in the ranks and when Sunland Park Racetrack opened in 1959 he was hired as the track's very first comptroller. A friendly man by nature, he befriended grooms, trainers and owners and became known as a

horseman's horseman. Among his accomplishments, he avoided an international incident by coming to terms with Juarez Racetrack, instituted simulcast betting in New Mexico and together with Tony Salerno, his son-in-law, brought Pocono Downs out of bankruptcy and made it a booming racing/casino operation. Mr. Johnson's philosophy, which he passed on to his son-in-law, was simple: Always be fair.

Hal Jones, 90, of Montgomery, NY, died Jan 31. Hal began his career as manager of Pickwick Farms in Bucyrus, Ohio, for Walter Michael. In 1960 Hal began breeding mares by artificial

insemination, instead of breeding by live cover, which was the norm at that time increasing the number of mares a stallion could breed in one season from 60 to over 100. In 1971 began a seven year career as manager of Hanover Shoe Farms. While he was their her purchased a 2% share in



Albatross. This he used to buy Cameo Hills Farm. Hal was inducted into the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame in 2010.

Richard J. Morris, 88, of Columbus, Ohio, died Feb. 27. Richard was a veteran of the US Merchant Marines in World War II and was retired from Ohio Bell Telephone Co. He had a 51-year affiliation with the Little Brown Jug, was a longtime scorekeeper for the Dublin-Coffman baseball team, and a Red Coat at Ohio Stadium for 35 years.

Bernard Leo "Bernie" Offutt, Jr. of Woodsboro, died February 4. Bernie continued in the long family tradition of owning, training and driving Standardbred horses as well as staying active in

farming.

Norwood Shahan, 75, died Feb 2. Norwood, a resident of Greenwood, DE, owned, trained and drove horses at the Mid-Atlantic area tracks for a number of years. He bred, raised and raced the outstanding pacer Abbe's Fancy. For two seasons, Abbe's Fancy, a former season's champion mare, was Horse of the Year at Dover Downs. In addition to racing at Delaware tracks, Abbe's Fancy won races at the Meadowlands.



Patricia (Pat) Simmons, 82, of Stow, Ohio, died Feb 11. Standardbred racing was a passion in Pat's life. She and her husband, Earl, were heavily involved in harness racing. She was Assistant Race Secretary at Northfield Park and also worked in the mutuels at night. "You don't find people like Pat every day. People like her are rare," said Gregg Keidel, her boss for more than 20 years. "She was a very gracious lady who never said a cross word about anyone."

David L Wing, 66, of Middletown ,NY died at his home on January 14. Dave was a Vietnam veteran and was a truck



mechanic at Eastern Alloy for 30 years. Dave grew up in Kingfield ,ME. His love of Standardbreds found him working at stables in Farmington, ME. Pompano, FL, Saratoga Springs, Blue Spruce Farm and most recently Bam Bury Cross Farm in NY. Dave loved and adored his family and leaves behind his

beloved wife of 41 years, Lynn, two daughters, and two beautiful grandchildren.

Walter E. Young, 95, of Barnesville, Ohio, died Feb 17. Walter owned and trained Standardbreds for more than 65 years. He drove and won his first race in 1945. He retired from RCA Corp. in Cambridge, Ohio, in 1958.

Saratoga or Monticello during Sire Stakes week and count think I am unhinged. I ask people if they know where they the Mercedes, Audis, or Lexus cars that pull into the parking lots. Or better yet attend a horse sale in



Lexington or Harrisburg and watch the exorbitant amounts people are willing to pay for yearling horses, sometimes one, two, or three hundred thousand, with no guarantee that they will ever race. Back in about 1980, I attended a horse sale in New Jersey where, I believe a full brother to Bret Hanover named

Boardwalk Chappie sold for 500,000 dollars. He never made it to the races. Wordsworth, Christmas, and the passing of Joe Robbins; I think most of us don't see the big picture.

Joe Robbins's death, my death, your death; do you think any of us will escape? We live in time, a beginning, a birth and an end, death. After a two-year stint in the US Army, Chuck began a 40-plus year career maintaining and building racetracks for horse racing. His work took his all over North America and in 2008 he was inducted into the Harness

Racing Hall of Fame.

Retired Major Marland "Doc" Dulaney, D.V.M. died Feb 1. He was a well decorated by the US Army and Marines receiving several medals including the Purple Heart.
