Jack Elliott, 91, the former director for televised productions at Scioto Downs and long-time film producer for the Little Brown Jug, as well as many other events in harness racing history, died July 3.

Vincent Fusco Sr, 74, of Freehold Township, NJ, died July 24 with his beloved family at his side. He is survived by his wife of 55 years, Grace.

Maynard Hagemeyer, 98, a long time advocate, owner, driver, trainer and breeder passed away July 16 in the same room he was born in November 22, 1918. He was a

WWII Captain in the Army from 1941-1946 having served in Africa and Italy. He is more recently known as the founder of Hagemeyer Farms, a standardbred

boarding, breeding, foal care and training center in Clarksville, Ohio. In 1957, he traded two burrows, a



pony and a hog feeder for a standardbred broodmare, Miss Win Dale. In his peak, the whole family was involved in training 60+ horses. Eventually, he focused on breeding with his first stud, Billy Jo Byrd. His last stud, Look Sharp, stood at Hagemeyer Farms for 25 years until he passed at 31. Ironically, Look Sharp passed away July 17, 2014, nearly 3 years to the day before Maynard. Maynard was very involved in promoting Harness Racing as a Director with the O.H.H.A. and the first president of the Harness Horse Youth Foundation. He also served as a Warren County Fairboard Director for 42 years. His proudest accomplishment was his family. He celebrated his 70th anniversary with his wife, Stella in 2015.

Jack Johnson, 64, of Decatur, IL, died March 23. Following graduation from college Jack worked for the Soil Conservation office for his entire career. He was heavily involved in harness racing as part of Johnson Brothers Farm. Jack was a member of the Pleasant Mills United Methodist Church.

Dwayne Pletcher, 85, of Shipshewana, IN, died July 5. Pletcher was one of the nation's top drivers and

developers of colts and a member of one of Chicago's most famous harness racing families. He drove his first race the day before he turned 15 at the Cassopolis, MI county fair, where in three heats with P.J. Volo he finished 2-2-1, his first win. After serving in the US Army Korea, he resumed harness racing as his career and passion. Dwayne won 1,477 races



including the Sportsman's Park Midwest Derby three times. In 1972 he trained Chaw, 1972 Illinois Horse of the Year.

Margaret Ann Phillips "Peggy" Cherrix Rodgers, 87, died July 12. Nicknamed "Sunshine" as an infant, she continued to spread that her entire life. She married Robert P. Cherrix, who always said he knew he would marry her in first grade. Together they built a successful harness horse racing stable until his untimely death at 43 years old. Peggy taught 2nd grade for 16 years while she spent her summers at Ocean Downs eventually serving as Assistant Racing Secretary. Eventually she semi-retired to Pompano with her second husband.

Earl Wayne Short, 71, of Greenwood, DE, died July 4 after a lengthy illness. Earl was always happy to help someone in need and volunteer his time, without expecting anything in return. He enjoyed farming, working in the produce market, training and racing standardbred horses, and riding the golf cart with his dog Sophie around the family farm. He loved spending time and talking on the phone with his family. He was always the person that everybody loved to be around because he made them laugh.

Gerald Leighton Smith, 72, of Old Orchard Beach, ME

died June 9. Gerry graduated cum laude from Springfield College in 1966, and later received his master's from University of Southern Maine. He taught physical education at Greely from 1967 until his retirement in 1985. After leaving teaching, Gerry pursued his real passion, harness racing. He bred, raised and raced



standardbreds with his partner Barry Howell.

Kelly Staten, 71, died July 23. Kelly, who learned to work with plow horses as a young child, got his first glimpse of harness racing after sneaking off to the West Virginia State Fair when he was just 8 years old. Though he served in the U.S. Army and worked for many years as a machinist, Mr. Staten bought his first racehorse in 1969. He went on to spend much of his life in the horse business, training and driving his own standardbreds as well as those for outside owners in Ohio, Pennsylvania and on the East Coast. Kelly was known for his success with problem horses.

Carroll Tiernan of Maine died last month following a long battle with cancer. Back in the 70's, Carroll worked

in the racing office at Scarborough Downs. According to then Presiding Judge, Roger Smith, She was a special lady and always available to help a green clerk or program director who was new to the racing office and often to the industry." Carroll was married to Billy Pillsbury. For many years, she served as Nature Store manager for the Maine Audubon Society. In that



role, she welcomed tens of thousands of visitors to Gilsland Farm, getting to know their interests and favorite birds, and finding ways to educate them about their work and Maine's wildlife.

Marc Bourgon, 60, died July 7. He suffered cardiac arrest while jogging a horse at Pocono Downs on July 4. Marc 's father, Wilfred Bourgon, was a horseman and blacksmith at Blue Bonnets Raceway in Montreal. Marc dedicated his entire life to harness racing, working as a groom, trainer, driver and blacksmith at tracks all over Canada and the United States since the early 1970's right up until his death.

William James "Billy" Carroll died July 26. Billy spent his adult life as a standardbred horse trainer. He raced summers and returned to Pinehurst to train and break horses during the winter months. Billy worked for Mike Medors for a long long time. He was a great guy and a great horsemen. His Grandfather trained horses with Earl Avery and for Norman Woolworth for many years in Pinehurst and many places. His Father trained in NJ for many years.

Clarence "Sonny" DeLong, 76, of Grove City, OH, died July 6. Sonny retired from the banking industry. He owned more than 60 harness horses and bred 17. He was a familiar face on the Ohio circuit. Sonny was a mason in the Grove City Masonic Lodge, treasurer of the Ohio Special Olympics for many years, and was on the board of directors and served as treasurer for the Grove City Kids
