Dominick Bologna, 79 formally of New City, and Queensbury, NY and most recently of Armonk, NY died on Aug 27. Dominick spent 20 years as a NYC police officer and Crime Squad Detective. When he retired in 1982 he went to work for the New York State Racing Board as an investigator. While there, he was asked to develop and initiate a drug testing and substance abuse program which is still in effect in New York State. He retired in October 2006. Dominick always tempered his work with licensees who had substance abuse problems with humanity, knowing that at times its frailties. He helped many people return from their demons knowing that the path for many of those he helped travelled through expected relapses. Dominick never lost faith in the human spirit to overcome even when those he was trying to help concocted some real good stories to avoid their own self-inflicted problems. He was indeed a good man himself and many in racing owe their second and third chances to his compassion.

James Durand "J.D." Dennis, 85, of Harrington, DE

died Sep 21. Beginning in 1960, JD raced horses throughout the East Coast from Canada to Florida. In 1965 he was the driver with the most wins at the inaugural Pocono Downs meet with 29 victories in the 30 day meet. He was very active in supporting the sport of harness racing. After retiring from racing, JD enjoyed watching races on talavision or going out to the track. He

had a special spot at the fence at Harrington Raceway to watch and talk with the horsemen. Many of the people would come up to him and talk about horses, and he was never at a loss for words.

Hilda M. Frediani, 84, died Sep 27. Hilda owned several Standardbred race horses including top Western New York trotting mare Laddies Irma. She attended Nazareth College and the University of Syracuse where she earned her Nursing Degree. She taught nursing at St. Mary's



Hospital in Rochester and was employed as a Nurse Practitioner at the Groveland Correctional Facility.

Rick Robert Gehron, 71, of Germantown, OH, died Sep 14. He was an owner, trainer, and driver for harness racing for 45 years and he enjoyed spending time at the track with his family.

Bradley Howard Hanners, 43, of Sabina, OH, died Sep 15 with his wife, Alicia, and children at his side. Brad was a great family man with a passion for the Standardbred business where he was an outstanding driver and trainer. He accumulated a total of 4,888 wins as a driver and 358 wins as



a trainer. Some of the better horses that he trained included Core Furst, Nannina, Paco Labrook and Rehab Mountain. He also loved watching his children play basketball and football. His children shared his passion for the horse business as well.

Dianne Jeannont, 64, of Colts Neck, NJ died Sep 9. Dianne was the owner of DJ Racing Stable and was a thoroughbred horse trainer for over 40 years. Her sister Kim Jeannont spent most of her life training Standardbreds.

Brandy Michele Burns Kise, age 31, of Unionville Center, died unexpectedly Sep 1. She was an

administrative clerk for Carlisle Gifts/ Der Dutchman in Plain City. Brandy received an associate's degree in early childhood development from Columbus State Community College and was a former director at Jelly Bean Junction Daycare Center in Columbus. She also worked as an assistant director at Lil



Tykes Learning Childcare Center in Marysville. She was a member of New California Presbyterian Church. Her grandmother, Joan Burns is a member of CHHA.

Malcolm R. "Mac" Parks, 64, of Lowville, NY died Sep 3. While in school, Mr. Parks worked on his parents' dairy farm in Depeyster. He graduated from Albany School of Pharmacy (Union College) in 1974. It appears Mac had a 40 year career as a pharmacist and also as a harness horsemen. He owned and operated Park's Breezy Knoll, a Standardbred horse breeding farm and racing stable.

Edwin Reynolds, 64, a Bangor Raceway employee, was

killed in a freak accident Sep 9 when he was struck with the wings of the starting gate. Track employees were working on the car in preparation for the meet that was scheduled to begin Sep 14 and 15. The track has cancelled racing for those two days and will not race until Oct 5 out of respect for Edwin, his family and the track employees.



John J. "JT" Taylor, 63, of Paris, MI died Sep 16. John's passion and lifetime career for 47 years was Standardbred training for Taylor Stables. His first race was at the age of 16 on May 31 in Marion with Delightful Lady. As a 16 year old in 1969, he took top honors for most wins on the Matinee circuit in Northern Michigan. On Dec. 9, 1971, at Northville Downs he had his first pari-mutuel start at age 18, also with Delightful Lady. John enjoyed hunting with his buddies and he was a fun loving man that was always willing to help a friend. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

Arthur Winkler, 71, died Sep 12 at his home in Lexington, VA. Arthur was a former executive with the New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority, Garden State Park and Freehold Raceway.
