
Leroy Amos, 64, of Navarre, Ohio, died Nov 28 from complications of a massive stroke. Leroy, a veteran of the Vietnam War became a farrier. His passion was Standardbreds, which he bred, raised and raced over a span of 30 years. In 1986, he authored *Limbs of the Equine*, which is still being circulated across academia and horse people globally. Outside of his career, he spent countless hours as a leader and volunteer in various national and local horse associations.

Robert E. "Bob" Botsch, 81, of Garrisons Lake, DE, died Dec 1. Bob was a US Army Medic during the Korean war. He used to raise, train and flow homing racing pigeons. He also enjoyed his Fox Hounds. Bob also owned, trained and drove Standardbreds for 57 years.

John "Jake" Chapman Jr. died Dec. 19, at his home in Orchard Park, NY. Jake was a horseman and a son of the late Hall of Fame horseman John Chapman. He was 60.

Donna J. Evans Hite, 79, of Coal Center, PA died Aug 23. She worked in the cafeteria for the Belle Vernon School District and was an avid race horse owner. Her son,

Susan M. Kelly, 74, of Manalapan went home to be with the Lord on November 27. Susan was retired after working side by side with her husband for many years in the horse business. She was a faithful member of the First Baptist Church in Freehold.

Kathleen Marshall, mother of USTA director Kenneth Marshall, died Dec 16. She was a resident of Hazel Park, MI. Robert William "Bobby" Miller, 73, of Leburn, KY, died Nov 4 in Deland, FL. Bobby has owned harness horses for many years.

Ebbert L. "Ed" Quinn, 84, of Mount Vernon, Ohio, died Nov 27. He was a Korean Conflict veteran, a retired heavy equipment operator and a Standardbred trainer. He loved spending time with his family, especially his grandchildren. He trained Standardbreds since 1949 and for 30-plus years at the Croton Fairgrounds.

Marty Jay Quist, 61, of Moline, IL died October 10. Marty enjoyed raising miniature horses. He and his wife, Debbie, were good friends of Evelyn Collins. He worked the last 31 years as a well respected insurance agent.

Anita Ratliff, who managed Thunder Ridge Racetrack in Kentucky with a big heart but little money, has died after a three-year battle with cancer. Anita worked in public accounting for 50 years before ending her career as general manager and chief financial officer of Appalachian Racing in Prestonsburg, KY.

George Raymond, 81, of Delhi Township, MI, died Nov 8. He and his wife, Dawn, bred Standardbreds until her death in 2010. George served in the US Army, worked briefly delivering milk for Heatherwood Dairies, and then landed a job selling advertising for the Mason, Mich., newspaper. By the end of his working career he owned that newspaper along with several other community shopping guides, and was a well-known local businessman and philanthropist. George would always count among his greatest accomplishments defeating the great Speedy Crown with his trotter

Dearborn Star in the Open Trot at Wolverine.

Jeffrey Alan Remy 65, of Columbus, Ohio, died Dec 4. Jeffrey entered the business working as a groom for trainers Ron Noel and Gene Riegle, and was a second trainer for Joe Adamsky. He loved developing young horses and escaping the Ohio winters by heading south to Pompano, FL and Hawkinsville, GA. Jeffrey also served as a racing official. However, his real passion was training.

Dr Rocovich died in 1990 in California He was a brain surgeon who also raised race horses. Chaplain John Prescott trained his horses at one time.

Paige H. West, 82, of Pompano Beach, FL, died Nov 23. He had been a local resident since 1986 after moving from Salisbury, MD. Paige was retired from the harness horse racing business. He was the trainer and sometimes driver of Adios Butler, the Horse of the Year in 1960 and 1961.

Robert J. (Bob) Williams Sr., 78, died Dec 9. Bob began his racing career in 1942. When he was six, he trained his first horse for his father, John Williams. He began his driving career in 1954 right after graduating high school. In the late 1950s owner Peter Katona entrusted his entire stable to the 23 year-old Robert who took full advantage of the opportunity by becoming a leading driver-trainer, first, in Michigan and then Illinois and California. After retiring as a trainer-driver in the late 1980s, Robert became a Paddock Judge at Muskegon Raceway then an Associate Judge at Toledo Raceway and Pompano Park. He was elected to the Florida USHWA Hall of Fame in 1999 with a similar honor in Michigan Harness Horsemen's Hall of Fame in 2004.

Dale Wood, 84, of New Hampton, NY died August 30. Dale trained horses at Historic Track, Goshen, NY. A NYU graduate, Dale worked as an electrical engineer. However, his first love was horses and he was a highly respected horsemen with many friends.

We felt that God was directing our lives and one of the first things we did was in the 70's. We worked with our Pastor and others in the community to copy other tracks and start a chaplaincy program. At first the chaplains were volunteers. We also held Vacation Bible School for the track children at the local Assembly of God Church. It didn't really take off until Ed Ryan helped to fund the program, and Pastor Joe DiDonato came on board. As they say, the rest is history. Our next years in Washington, PA area were spent supporting the ministry at the track and other missionaries around the world.

Toward the end of our time at "The Meadows," I took a trip to Haiti to help with their animals. This began my more extensive involvement in missions. About three years ago, Ruth and I spent two weeks working in Honduras. Every day we went to a different village and did what needed to be done with the villagers' animals. Ruth played with and read about Jesus to the children. In the last couple of years, I have spent most of my time and energy going on mission trips to help Native Americans with their animals. I have gone to the Cherokee in NC, the Navajo in the southwest and the Sioux in SD. I go through the Christian Veterinary Mission (CVM) with fellow veterinarians, vet students and vet techs. The theme for CVM is: sharing God's love through caring for animals.

Ruth and I are planning to go to Central America again this Spring. I will be doing spays, neuters, vaccinations, castrations, floating teeth and deworming. We do this all at a nominal cost to the owner. I'm sure you can imagine the cost involved.



Instructions

Minimum raise is \$100. Winning bidders owe a 10%, minimum \$100, deposit postmarked by February 3, 2015. The balance (90%) is due on the birth of a live foal. There is no return privilege. Please only bid on breedings you intend to use. This is CHHA's main fundraiser.

No ownership change on a mare is permitted until the service fee is paid unless a statement from a licensed veterinarian declaring the mare is not in foal is provided to CHHA. Please do not bid for mares over 20 years old or mares that have been barren two or more consecutive years. Please do not bid on a stallion for which you already have a contract.
